**TEACHING POINT**

Communion under both kinds by intinction (dipping the host in the chalice) is not recommended in the dioceses of England and Wales. When individuals are unwilling to receive directly from the chalice, perhaps because of colds or other illness, they are advised to receive Holy Communion under one kind for the duration of their illness. If intinction is, exceptionally, permitted then all members of the congregation will be invited to receive Holy Communion under this form. However, individual communicants can choose to receive under the form of Bread alone. If offered in this way, Holy Communion may only be administered by a minister and may never be self-administered.
