### FAITHFUL WITNESS

More than 25,000 people gathered in a rainy St Peter's Square last Sunday for the beatification Mass of Pope John Paul I, celebrated by Cardinal Marcello Semeraro, Prefect of the Dicastery for the Causes of Saints. Born on 17<sup>th</sup> October 1912 in Forno di Canale (today Canale d'Agordo), in the north Italian province of Belluno, Pope John Paul I died on 28<sup>th</sup> September 1978 in the Vatican. Albino Luciani was Pope for only 34 days, one of the shortest pontificates in history. He was the son of a socialist worker who had worked for a long time as an emigrant in Switzerland.
