TODAY'S CELEBRATION

The Catholic Church teaches as dogma that the Virgin Mary "having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory". This was dogmatically defined by Pope Pius XII on 1st November 1950 in the apostolic constitution Munificentissimus Deus by the exercise of papal infallibility. While belief in the Dormition of the Mother of God (Dormition of the Theotokos or "the Falling Asleep of the Mother of God") is Catholic teaching, whether Mary had a physical death as the New Eve has not been dogmatically defined. In Munificentissimus Deus (item 39) Pope Pius XII pointed to the Book of Genesis (3:15) as scriptural support for the dogma in terms of Mary's victory over sin and death through her intimate association with "the new Adam" (Christ) as reflected in the passage from 1 Corinthians 15:54: "then shall come to pass the saying that is written, Death is swallowed up in victory".

POWERFUL PLEADINGS

This Wednesday, 18th August 2021 marks the beginning of Birmingham Diocese's Novena to pray for the Canonisation of Blessed Dominic Barberi. The Novena of Prayer lasts for nine days and concludes on his feast day on Thursday, 26th August Blessed Dominic arrived at Aston Hall in Staffordshire in February 1842. He spent the next seven years based there, from where he celebrated Mass, preached Missions, heard confessions, and received many people into the Catholic Church, the most famous being St John Henry Newman in October 1845. Well known for his sanctity and holiness of life, Blessed Dominic is also remembered for his love for the poor, and those in need of prayer and help.
